Consultation on joining a multi academy trust

I am writing to seek your views on the important question of whether the school should join a multi academy trust known as The Athelstan Trust (the **Trust**).

Sir William Romney's school continues to grow and students have enjoyed their sixth successive year of achieving a positive Progress 8 score which means that students make better progress than expected across their five years at SWR. Our total commitment to an inclusive and comprehensive education enables all students to make very good academic progress. Working together with our students and families, we remain committed to a broad and vibrant curriculum that offers a wealth of extra-curricular opportunities for all students. With our reputation and student population rapidly growing, our governing body have voted to formally consult with all students, parents, staff and our local community on Sir William Romney's School joining the Athelstan trust.
