## PD this week

On Tuesday, as part of our Personal Development programme our year 7 and year 9 watched a new play performed by Our Time called 'My Mad Mum', which explores the impact of a parent's mental health issue on their children. The students listened well, and they really enjoyed the play.

On Thursday, Year 8 watched a play called Chelsea's Story. It tackled the difficult issue of Child Sexual Exploitation and Grooming. There was an opportunity for interaction with the actors helping pupils to see the choices Chelsea made and how she might have chosen differently. This was a hard hitting, loud performance which is based on a true story. Students were shocked to learn that the age of children most at risk was between 11 and 15 years old. The students were fantastic, demonstrating great maturity with excellent questions from our students at the end.

## **Monday Clubs Transport**

To support our students being able to access the range of clubs we have on offer on a Monday we provide a free minibus service to Avening, Nailsworth (Bus station) and Horsley (The Hog).

This is driven by Mr Radcliffe and leaves school at 4.30pm. If your child wishes to access a club and get the minibus home, they must book a place in the office as seat numbers are limited, this is offered on a first come first served basis.
