Following recent events at other local schools and colleges, I would also like to reassure you that the fire drill we held on Thursday was pre-planned and part of our regular safety procedures. I am pleased to share that we evacuated the entire school and had students lined up on the tennis courts ready for registers in just three minutes.

At SWR we prepare for two types of emergency: evacuation drills and lockdown drills. Lockdown is something we have been developing in response to incidents in schools across the country. While we hope never to need it, it is important that we are prepared. Last year we ran a walkthrough practice, and before the end of this term we will hold a full lockdown drill. We will ensure that both students and parents receive plenty of notice and guidance in advance, as we recognise this may feel unsettling for some.

This week in my assemblies I spoke about democracy and the importance of student voice in driving positive change at our school. I shared two powerful examples:

- At the start of the year, Connor, our Head Boy, approached me with feedback from students on some improvements for the canteen. I arranged for him to meet with the regional catering manager, and last week they had a very productive discussion. Connor was excellent—he presented his points clearly, listened carefully, and agreed on actions to move forward. He is a young leader with great potential and one to watch for the future.
- Last year we also received a letter about nose studs. The student wrote politely and persuasively, explaining how they could allow personal expression while still maintaining a neat and professional appearance. This prompted the Senior Leadership Team to reflect, and as you know, we changed the rules this September. After challenging nose studs for 20 years, it now feels the right decision—and it would not have happened without that thoughtful letter.

These examples highlight how valuable student voice is to SWR's culture. Listening to our students not only helps shape our school but also gives them a real sense of ownership and responsibility.
